Bishop Richard writes:

We live in a world where confidence seems to be a requirement, for confidence speaks of strength and our society does not wish to appear weak. Yet, beneath this veneer of confidence lies much anxiety and doubt. This affects different people in different ways, from an overreliance on technology to experiences of isolation, and the manifestation of challenges to mental health at so many levels.

Today's Gospel brings us face-to-face with the problem of doubt in the person of Thomas the Apostle. Like so many in our modern times, he would not accept the word of his friends. He wanted to see for himself, and if he could not, he would not believe. In the midst of his doubts, the Lord Himself stood before him. Thomas' doubts were dispelled and he professed his faith with the simple, yet wonderful words: "My Lord and my God."

Perhaps there are times in our lives when we doubt – perhaps the experience of life, the grim realities of the world around us, bring us to doubt, to question. We must know that in our times of doubt, the Lord stands before us. As with Thomas, He is gentle towards us. The Lord says to us, as He says to Thomas: 'Here I am, gaze upon me, see what I have done for you. Believe.'

On this Divine Mercy Sunday, may we recognise in a new and everdeeper way, all that the Lord has done for us. In His dying and rising He gives us new life. In saying, with Thomas, "My Lord and my God" we shall know the mercy that only He can give, and experience that peace the world cannot give; the peace that is the gift of the Risen Christ.'

Divine Mercy Sunday: This Sunday, April 16th, is Divine Mercy Sunday; it is a tradition going back to at least the 4th century in the church when the following Sunday after Easter Day reflects the mercy of God towards us as seen in the Resurrection of Jesus. There are devotions this Sunday from 2.45-3.30pm at CTK which include adoration, sung Chaplet and Benediction. All welcome.
