A message from Bishop Richard about Remembrance Sunday

Remembrance Sunday is, as in any year, a day on which we remember all who have died in armed conflict. Great numbers will gather at war memorials in villages, towns and cities across the country, with a particular focus on the Remembrance Service at the Cenotaph in London. The lists of names on our memorials are a poignant reminder of the impact of warfare on families and on communities. Many still carry the mental and physical scars of warfare; we pray for them and for their families, and for all who have lost loved ones.

This year, as the conflict in Ukraine continues, we must pray for all those affected by this ongoing armed struggle as it continues into yet another winter. The situation in Gaza, brings with it – as is the case in any armed conflict – immense suffering to great numbers of people who find themselves unavoidably in harm's way. The irreparable loss for parents, children, families and friends is a tragedy for the whole of humanity. As we pray for peace, let us seek also to assist, even remotely, in the aid that will be needed to rebuild and to restore broken lives.

St Paul reminds us, in his letter to the Romans, that not even death can separate us from the love of God. St Paul's conviction is born of the hope and trust that comes from his experience of the Risen Christ – an experience we share through baptism and at every celebration of the Eucharist. We find this hope, too, in our times of personal prayer and in the example and service of others who share this same hope. This is a hope we must bring to our society, especially when tensions rise around us, that all may see a way in the darkness that befalls us.

Prompted by the Spirit, we are called to bring the healing presence of God's love to a suffering world. May our acts of remembrance today prompt us to prayer, and to action, for the world we are now called to serve, that all may know lasting peace.

November is the month of the Holy Souls. There are various opportunities for us to remember and pray for the Holy Souls in Purgatory during this month. Among them are :

November Votive Candles: Forms for the 7 day votive candles placed in the Sacred Heart chapel are available. We light a candle for 7 days in memory of our departed loved ones during November, the month of the Holy Souls. These will run for the whole of November. Suggested donation £5.00.

November Prayer Lists: these are available for you to include the names of your departed loved ones; they are placed on the sanctuary during November and remembered at daily Mass. Lists available at the back of the church.

Litany for the Holy Souls in Purgatory is available at the back of the church to help us in our devotions during November, reflecting on the faithful departed.

Rosary during November at CTK will be recited each Sunday at 10.45am. All welcome as we pray for the Holy Souls in purgatory.

Remembrance Sunday - 12th November. A special memorial service will be held on Remembrance Sunday at St Joachim's Church to remember those who died in the First and Second World Wars and other armed conflicts. Service starts at 4 pm. Please bring photographs of loved ones to place by the altar if you wish.
