## Bishop Richard writes:

Last week has seen the celebration of a number of saints who have, I suggest, particular significance for us. On Wednesday we celebrated St Cuthman of Steyning – a saint of our own Diocese. His life was marked by care for his mother – whom he moved around in a wheelbarrow – and his building of a church in Steyning. The greatest witness of this saint of pre-Norman times was his great simplicity of life, grounded in prayer – examples that we do well to follow in these times when we are called to witness to the Gospel as never before.

On the same day, the Church celebrated St Josephine Bakhita, trafficked into slavery when only a young girl. Saved from her life of slavery by a family in Italy she later responded to the call to religious life. In a world where so many are trafficked, she reminds us of the dignity of the human person and calls us to respond to the needs of our sisters and brothers so cruelly treated.

Let us also remember those who come to our shores as refugees, fleeing war and injustice in their home countries. Our diocesan Refugee Project continues and I invite you to continue our welcome to those who seek a new home here, through prayer, through the commitment of time and accompaniment and through donations to our Refugee Fund.

On Saturday, we celebrate the Feast of Our Lady of Lourdes – the Day of Prayer for the Sick. Mary calls us to Lourdes, a pilgrimage that is such an important part of our diocesan life. I know that many will be seeking to join this year's pilgrimage and I look forward to being there with you. Mary our Mother calls us to see her Son in those around us and Pope Francis, in his message for this day writes: "Brothers and sisters, we are rarely prepared for illness. Oftentimes, we fail even to admit that we are getting older. Our vulnerability frightens us and the pervasive culture of efficiency pushes us to sweep it under the carpet, leaving no room for our human frailty." Mindful of the frailty and weakness that is present in every one of us, let us do all we can to strive against the isolation that is so prevalent in our present society, ensuring that all recognise their value and dignity and know the love of Him who carries our weaknesses for us.
