Bishop Richard reflects on Pope Francis's new Apostolic Exhortation on Climate Change, 'Laudate Deum':

'Dear brothers and sisters, On Wednesday of this week, the Feast of St Francis, the Holy Father issued an Apostolic Exhortation on the Climate Crisis. The title – Laudate Deum – comes, as is the custom, from the first words of the letter: Praise God for all creatures. This document comes eight years after Laudato Si' and Pope Francis makes clear that the motivation for his letter arises from the insufficient action across the world in these intervening years, and the impact this has on everyone - especially the most vulnerable.

The Holy Father speaks of climate change as a global reality, and the responsibility that we have for this change. The Holy Father examines the many causes of this phenomenon in some detail, including the demands on natural resources that arise in an increasingly technocratic age – something that it is easy to overlook – and he relates this to the desire for power that is so often a part of our human desire, seeking to place ourselves in God's place. He speaks of the current situation in international politics and outlines the journey made by the COP conferences, noting the difficulties that are encountered in attempts to come to agreements. He speaks of the poor implementation of the COP accords.

The Holy Father goes on to speak of the motivation borne of faith, arising from the goodness of creation and the beauty of the gift that is our world – calling us to relate more closely to the gift of creation that we have been given.

We may feel that that task is too great, but the Holy Father addresses this also, pointing out that little things can make a difference and calling us to cultural change, especially for those of us living in richer nations.

Do read this letter, which is direct in its message and let us re-commit ourselves to do what we can at domestic and local level, seeking to be a part of a cultural change towards effective care for our brothers and sisters and the world for which care is our responsibility.
