Bishop Richard reflects on the solemnity of St Philip Howard :

I am writing this week's podcast on the feast of St Philip Howard, patron of the Diocese. We will mark the feast at the Cathedral this Sunday, as is the custom, bringing together all those who assist the life of the Cathedral, through the work of the Friends of Arundel Cathedral.

We might be tempted to see St Philip, in his Elizabethan dress, as someone who might have little to say to us, but I suggest that he is very much a saint for our own age. He was attracted to the ways of Elizabeth I's Court and to the political life of his day. He abandoned family and faith to seek celebrity. So, in a world where celebrity - short lived as it is - has come to mean so much, this aspect of his life can be a timely warning.

St Philip's waywardness found its end through an encounter with Edmund Campion, who would himself be martyred for the faith, and whose skills in debate and clarity of thought brought Philip to see the shallowness of his life, and the need to return to his family and to his faith. How often does the example of another encourage us on our journey?

At a time when professing the Catholic faith was a dangerous thing to do he found strength and resolve to remain steadfast. Even separation from family during his long years in the Tower of London - so different to his wilful abandonment of them during his time at Court - could not shake his resolve. Deprivations brought with them ill health, but also a closeness to Christ that found expression in the writing of prayers and hymns. For him, Christ was all.

May St Philip's example call us out of waywardness to firm resolve in the profession of our faith, and in the example of Christian living that we are called to be in a world so often set on the shallow path of consumerism and celebrity, torn apart by violence and war, and - just as in St Philip's own time - so needing to hear the call of Christ to unity with Him, and to the peace the world cannot give.
