#### Bishop Richard reflects on the Feast of the Epiphany.

The joy of the Christmas season continues and we celebrate this Sunday the feast of the Epiphany – the visit of the Magi to the infant Jesus.

This is a significant celebration, for these somewhat mysterious men, who follow the star to find the Messiah, are not of the chosen people of Israel. So, in that sense, they represent all those across the world who, like them, are gentiles – all those who come to be the community that has Abraham as our father in faith but are not of Abraham's race.

The Epiphany – the showing – of Christ to the world is the wonder we celebrate, therefore, this Sunday, Jesus shows Himself to us.

The men from the East bring their gifts to the Christ-child. This Sunday's celebration poses a question for you and for me: what do I bring to Christ? This is an interesting question, for we must recognise that all we have — all we are — is gift. We give to the Lord what has first been given to us: our God-given talents, our skills, all we have learnt, all our experience; indeed, all that we are. We are called to give everything to Christ, to live every moment of our lives as a gift to Him — in service of Him and in service of our brothers and sisters. This is the wonder of the Christian life and it is in the giving that we find the fullness of life.

<u>'20+C+M+B+24'</u>, saying 'The 3 wise men, Caspar, Melchior, and Balthazar followed the star of God's Son who became human 2 thousand and 24 years ago. May Christ bless our home and remain with us throughout the year. Amen.'

End with the following prayer:

'Visit, O blessed Lord, this home with the gladness of your presence. Bless all who live or visit here with the gift of your love; and grant that we may manifest your love to each other and to all whose lives we touch. May we grow in grace and in the knowledge and love of you; guide, comfort, and strengthen us in peace, O Jesus Christ, now and for ever. Amen'

The Bishop's pastoral plan has been published! It's called 'The Word who is Life - The Call to Mission'. There are copies of an abridged version available in the church, and it is also accessible online.

The big takeaway is that, in the next couple of years, all the deaneries in the diocese will become 'moderated parishes'.

What does that mean? Well for us it means that our Deanery, which stretches from Hailsham and Polegate in the west to Rye in the east, will be a single parish for which all the priests will have joint responsibility. So instead of eight, more or less independent parishes, in our deanery, there will be one big parish: a 'community of communities', as the Bishop said in his Pastoral Letter a few weeks ago.
