

# Third Sunday of Advent 14 December 2025

Dr Scott Hahn reflects on the coming Kingdom

John questions Jesus from prison in today's Gospel—for his disciples' sake and for ours.

He knows that Jesus is doing "the works of the Messiah," foretold in today's First Reading and Psalm. But John wants his disciples—and us—to know that the Judge is at the gate, that in Jesus our God has come to save us.

The Liturgy of Advent takes us out into the desert to see and hear the marvellous works and words of God—the lame leaping like a stag, the dead raised, the good news preached to the poor (see Isaiah 29:18–20; 61:1–2).

The Liturgy does this to give us courage, to strengthen our feeble hands and make firm our weak knees. Our hearts can easily become frightened and weighed down by the hardships we face. We can lose patience in our sufferings as we await the coming of the Lord.

As James advises in today's Epistle, we should take as our example the prophets who spoke in the name of the Lord.

Jesus also points us to a prophet—holding up John as a model. John knew that life was more than food, the body more than clothing. He sought the kingdom of God first, confident that God would provide (see Matthew 6:25–34). John did not complain. He did not lose faith. Even in chains in his prison cell, he was still sending his disciples—and us—to our Saviour.

We come to Him again now in the Eucharist. Already He has caused the desert to bloom, the burning sands to become springs of living water. He has opened our ears to hear the words of the sacred book, freed our tongue to fill the air with songs of thanksgiving (see Isaiah 30:18).

Once bowed down, captives to sin and death, we have been ransomed and returned to His Kingdom, crowned with everlasting joy. Raised up, we now stand before His altar to meet the One who is to come: "Here is your God."

Rorate Masses continue at Our Lady of Ransom Church at 6:30am on Fridays during Advent: this coming Friday is the last one this year. The Mass is a candlelit Mass of Our Lady greets the dawn to look forward to the Light of the world. The Mass takes its name from the introit, *Rorate caeli*, "Drop down dew from heaven." Mass is followed by breakfast; it

should be possible to catch trains after Mass at 0728 to Lewes and London, and 0731/0744 to Bexhill/Hastings.

An Advent Course, Mary and Joseph speak to us today, is being run on Tuesdays after Mass at CTK (9:30am before Mass this week) and on Wednesdays after Mass at St Joachim's. All are welcome to either session.

CWL Christmas Tree of Giving provides an opportunity to buy a gift for a needy child this Christmas. Pick a bauble containing the name of a child with a gift idea from the Christmas tree in the Lady Chapel at CTK. Bring your gift and place it under the tree by next Sunday. The designated charity is *Warming Up the Homeless*, which supports children and families in temporary accommodation.

New Mass times after Christmas at CTK: Friday Mass will be at 10am; Tuesday Mass will be at 12 noon from 6 January.

**Booking is now closed for the Epiphany Celebration Meal** which will take place on Saturday 10 January at the Alexandra Arms.

The Repository at CTK has as a wide selection of Christian Christmas cards available at reasonable prices as well as handmade candles. The repository is open after both weekend Masses.

**Matthew 25 Mission** is in need of donations at this time of the year. They particularly need tinned and package foodstuffs, long life milk, coffee and tea, dry pasta, as well as men's and women's winter clothes.

Pilgrimage to Poland May 2026: the parish is organising a seven-day pilgrimage to Poland from 26 May to 1 June 2026, including the shrine in Częstochowa and the Divine Mercy Basilica in Krakow as well as visits to Auschwitz, Wadowice and the Wieliczka Salt Mine.
